# Service Report

## General Condition

The Fogfruit is thriving now that it is getting water (rain and/or irrigation). The sides of the property continue to be a problem.

## Weeding Rating

Weeds – 3.5 / Grass – 5+

## Service Provided

- Weeding the seed heads out of the front bed of Fogfruit.
- Deadheaded the Tropical Sage in the front beds.
- Deadheaded and trimmed back the Rosinflower in the left-hand back corner bed.
- Removed the grass, weeds and small amount of Fogfruit between the shrubs and the pathway to create a continuous bed instead of islands of shrubs (on the left-hand side).
- Trimmed the Skyblue Cluster Vine so that it stays away from the screened porch.
- Trimmed the Dune Sunflower off the driveway and the left-hand side pathway.
- Started weeding across the back of the property – rain stopped play!

## Good News

The wildlife continues to flourish!! We saw 5 White Peacock Butterflies drinking the nectar on the Fogfruit. We also noticed White Peacock Caterpillars on the Fogfruit. A Monarch Butterfly was laying eggs on the front Swamp Milkweed!

## Concerns

The sides continue to be a problem, this issue is going to be resolved by removing the Fogfruit on either side and replacing it with turf to match the neighbors. Kirsten marked with flags where the turf should be added.

## Recommendations

Continue joining the shrubs to create one long narrow bed along the left-hand side of the property to meet up with the pathway. This should only have pine straw in it for ease of maintenance.

The edging that runs along the sides of the property will be utilized to create an edging along the beds or pathway whichever is on the outside edge.
